What a fantastic start to our Autumn Half Term 2 we are having at Woodhouse! Your children have been great in their efforts to develop their learning and build on the fine start which they made to the new school year.

Last week, we spent a lot of time thinking hard about remembrance and the incredible sacrifice and service given by so many people over the years. We particularly thought about the end of World War 1 and the incredible legacy of that horrific conflict. The children have been reflecting on remembrance and the poignancy of the poppy. Children worked as a whole school to produce a fantastic art installation of a giant poppy on the playground – using their books to create a much greater image together than would be possible on their own. In classes children have been creating artwork as well as studying and writing war poetry. We had a very special service of remembrance as a school on Friday. I was very proud of how sensitive, reflective and respectful our children were throughout the week. This week we have been taking part in the national anti-bullying week within school and next week we will be thinking all about democracy. The themes the children learn about through assemblies, collective worship and PSHE are key components to becoming effective citizens of the future. We have all enjoyed two wonderful class assemblies this week, from 2M and 5S. It was wonderful to see the hard work which had gone into preparing for a public performance from children and staff. Thank you all those parents who were able to support the children, it is very much appreciated. I am very grateful for the wonderful support from families which our school receives and thank you all for the effort you put in to getting the best for your child. You received the half termly curriculum newsletters this week, and there are a number of ideas of how you can support your child at home across the curriculum. 
