Dear parents and carers,

As a very chilly week draws to a close, I would like to say thank you to those of you who attended Parents' evenings this week, with further dates still to come before half term. It is great to share the progress and learning with you and to provide you with the opportunity to ask questions, raise concerns or seek support. If you were or are unable to attend, then please speak to your teacher, we can arrange a further meeting or phone call at a mutually convenient time so that you can be kept totally up to date. If there is anything that we in school can help with, remember you don't need to wait until a parents' evening, please just let us know - we will be happy to do all that we can.

We are very fortunate in school that we have some supportive family volunteers who come into school and read with children. If you can spare some time each week, or on a more ad hoc basis and you would be interested in reading with the children, then please speak to me or with the office. There is a straightforward process to go through to register and undertake the appropriate safeguarding checks which we can undertake in school. This support is a really positive addition to all we offer to help children in school and can be a very rewarding and enjoyable experience.

In January, there are lots of colds, coughs and bugs going round and that goes someway to explaining the relatively low attendance figures for last week. 

Year 6 War Stories

Year 6 have begun a new topic this term called War Stories. They will be learning all about The Great War and immersing themselves in various aspects of the war.

To kick off their learning, they visited the Arthur Vickers VC Memorial Trenches to experience first-hand what it was like in the trenches. The weather was very cold so they got a slight experience of the suffering that would've taken place.

Following their visit, they welcomed a guest speaker to tell them a story of a particular solider from the Great War called Private Peter Kennedy who was a member of the Tyneside Irish battalion in the Northumberland Fusiliers. Peter is a relative of Mrs Kennedy, our office manager and Mr Kennedy, our Learning Mentor.

The children learnt all about where Peter came from and how he joined the army. He fought in and survived the Battle of The Somme and later died on patrol in 1917. The children were very interested in the story and it helped them put a face to some of the soldiers that they had previously learnt about.
