Dear parents and carers,

As we come to the end of this short half term, it has been wonderful to read your feedback and responses to our parent questionnaire. As a school, we are always seeking to improve what we do and the voice of parents is a key part of that. I was humbled by the overwhelming positivity and support shown in your feedback. Thank you for taking the time to let us know how things are going. I am delighted that so much is going well, but we are not complacent about the need to provide the very best for our children. We are still in the process of going through the specific queries and suggestions of what we could do even better and will be in touch to respond where you have indicated that you would like this to happen.

Our core focus is on the education, safety and care for the children of Woodhouse. The dedicated staff team work so hard to enable your child to have an excellent education, to develop their learning, to develop confidence and skills whilst building knowledge and understanding. We are continually seeking to improve this further, and as a staff we are committed to success. I am so pleased that so many of you recognise the hard work and quality of education on offer at our school.

Many of the responses indicated that we need to do better to share the impact and role that the Local Governing Board (LGB) members make to our school. The LGB is a crucial part of governing and running our school, so we will be featuring feedback and information about the LGB members in newsletters in the future, so that you can find out more about them. This will let you know what they have done to support and develop school and also about the progress our school is making. There will also be an annual LGB report to parents coming out with your child's report in July which will inform you about the work undertaken over the whole year.

Some parents expressed some concerns about the school meals which are provided by school, so we will work hard to listen to the children's views and see what we can do to improve this. We are always open to improvement, so the wonderful, hardworking Kitchen team will undertake a review of options and possible adaptations to the menu which we could make. As we have done previously, our school cabinet will have the chance to share children's views on what they do or don't like so that the healthy, nutritious meals provided are also going to be popular choices. As I am sure you can imagine, this is a tough balancing act to get right – but we will look at ways in which we can improve.

There were a few responses about the condition of the school buildings, especially some of the toilets in school. This is something which I am delighted to say is at quite an advanced stage in the refurbishment process for toilets in the main school building (Y5/6 and Y2/3/4). Through our position in the University of Wolverhampton Multi Academy Trust, we are being supported financially to make a significant investment in much better toilets for the children, and we are moving through the planning and inspection stage currently. Again, this is something which the school cabinet have been heavily involved in. We have invested in a number of areas to support the efficient use of our building and there are further planned improvement works still to come. We will continue to ensure that school is a welcoming and engaging learning environment in a positive state of repair.

We are a team at Woodhouse – children, families and staff. It is great that we can count on one another for support and constructive challenge to improve further. Thank you all for your engagement with this process.




