Dear parents and carers,

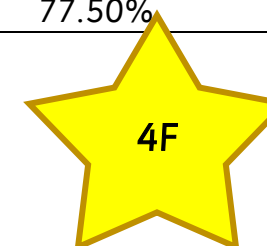

Congratulations to **2WP & 4F** who had the best class attendance for last week. We had 78 lates last week across all year groups. These, no matter how small, are lost learning time.

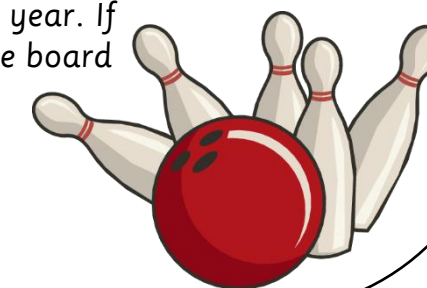
