

Dear parents,

Welcome back to all our families as we begin the new school year. I would like to also take this opportunity to welcome the children and families who have started at Woodhouse just this term, we look forward to working closely with you to provide a first class education for your child.

Since we returned to school last week, the children have made an excellent start to life in their new classes. They have been working hard in school to demonstrate our assembly theme for the week – Starting as we mean to go on. Thank you to all parents for ensuring your child is so smartly dressed in their uniform, including black school shoes, it shows the real pride the children have in themselves and our school. 
