



Dear parents,

Since our last newsletter, we have been gripped by election fever at Woodhouse. At our school, the children have a strong voice in how our school is run through our school cabinet. Children from Y2-6 have been putting themselves forward, making speeches to their peers and putting themselves up for election to our school cabinet. It was great to see the children voting and exercising their democratic right to select a representative. Congratulations to all those elected by their peers, as well as those who were brave enough to put themselves forward for election. Our year 6 children have applied to be appointed as Head boy and girl, Deputy Head girl and boy, prefects, school cabinet representatives for the younger children or playground leaders. Each child undertook an interview with Mr Kennedy and I and we were so impressed with the quality of their applications and responses to our questions. Teachers choose those who really impress them to share their learning with me and it is brilliant to see the effort, commitment and pride which the children show in their work.

One of the aspects we want to grow during this year is our work in the wider community. You will have read about the new friends of Pitts wood group which is being established and I would encourage you to get involved if this is something which is of interest. If you have any ideas about how we could better support the wider school community and those beyond our school, please let me know.

We sent a letter about attendance out to families last week. As you know, we worked really hard last year to improve our attendance with the school making a strong improvement in our attendance. Please continue to encourage your child to have strong attendance, including arriving on time and being ready for learning each day. If there is any support which school can offer, please just ask. Thank you to all parents for ensuring your child is so smartly dressed in their uniform, including black school shoes. It is wonderful to see our school looking so smart. 



# CHILDREN'S TOILET DEVELOPMENT

Over the summer and into the first few weeks of term, we have been having some exciting building work going on at Woodhouse. Our children's toilets have been long overdue an upgrade so in collaboration with our School Cabinet, we have designed some new ones to bring them up to date.

All of the colours and designs were chosen by the children on the School Cabinet and over the summer the work began. Phase one was the KS1 toilets, everything was taken out and replaced, including the walls and doors.

They were open for business for the first time on Monday 16<sup>th</sup> and all we have heard all day is gasps of amazement at how much better they are.

Phase two work has now commenced on updating the KS2 toilets. All KS1 and KS2 children will be using the new toilets whilst the work is carried out on the KS2 ones.

The work is expected to be completed by half term.

#### **PUPIL LEADERS**

Over the past few weeks we have been assembling our School Cabinet for the coming academic year. As in previous years, each class from years 2 - 6 has a class representative. Nursery, Reception and Year 1 are each represented by a Year 6 child.

Children were given the opportunity to apply by writing a short explanation as to why they would make a good representative. Between three and six candidates were then chosen anonymously to stand for election. Candidates gave a short speech to their classes on why they should vote for them before they went to cast their votes. The following children were elected by their classes to represent them:

Dedar is our Head Boy, Grace B is our Head Girl. They will be supported by Ben and Fatima as Deputy Head Boy and Girl. The four of them will take a lead role on the School Cabinet.

In addition to our Head Boy and Girl we have appointed five prefects; Henry, Vanessa, Yushra, Danielle and Denisa will take an active role in events such as open mornings.

Last but by no means least, we also appointed seven play leaders. These children expressed the interest and desire to support the younger children of Woodhouse at playtimes. Macie, Grace F, Hiba, Tehlil, Salah, Amelia and Annmaria have proved that they are excellent role models for the younger children. They will lead and support games at playtimes as well as leading teams of playground buddies.

We are extremely proud of all of our Pupil Leaders and the way they have gone about applying for the positions they have earned. They are all a credit to their class, their families and the Woodhouse community as a whole.
