Dear parents and carers,

What a fantastic Autumn term we are having so far at Woodhouse! Your children have been superb as they have settled fully into their new classes and they are working hard to develop their learning. As you will know, we have worked hard as a school to develop our knowledge-engaged curriculum, especially in our theme lessons. The children have produced some amazing work in theme and also in their English lessons to demonstrate the in-depth historical and geographical knowledge which they have been learning. We have all enjoyed two super class assemblies from Year 6 (with another next week!) where the children demonstrated some of the detailed learning which has been going on. It is privilege for me to see so much of the learning and good work from across the school. Your children produce so much work to be proud of and are supported by our first class dedicated staff team. Please take the time to ask your child about what they have been learning in their lessons each day, and encourage them to find out even more so that they can bring even more to their learning.

I look forward to you coming to parent's evenings over the next two weeks to discuss the progress being made by your child so far this term. Our now established parents' evenings on Thursday next week and Tuesday the week after are to try to give all families more time with their child's teacher and support the ongoing strong relationships between school and home. If you have not yet been able to arrange an appointment, then please do come and speak to the office to assist you. It may be that neither of those days are suitable for you, in which case please see your child's teacher and we will do everything we can to enable you to find out about the progress of your child. This can be face to face, or even through a phone call. It is vital that you are fully informed about the progress, learning and next steps for your child, and that we as a school hear any queries or concerns which you may have. Our inclusion team are also available for appointments if you have any queries about how we can better support your child. Thank you all for your support with this, it is very much appreciated.

After some fantastic progress with ensuring our school attendance is as good as possible during last year, I have been delighted with the way in which the children have come back to school so far this term. This year, we are looking to improve this even further. We at school are grateful that our parents and families recognise that education is so crucial to the future life chances of a child, and that we cannot afford for children to miss their learning. Not being in school means children may fall behind their peers educationally and socially. Missing lessons obviously has a knock on effect to the knowledge and understanding children have and can impact on their attainment and progress. Thank you for all you do to ensure good attendance, I am particularly grateful to those parents who work so hard to support children with medical conditions or appointments. As you know, we as a school celebrate all attendance which is great – and anything above 97% is fantastic. We also recognise the hard work from parents and families which goes on to help all children to attend and overcome some of the challenges to being in school and ready for learning each day. Thank you, as always, for your help and support. If there is any support that school can offer you in this area – please just ask. As with all things regarding your child: we will do everything in our power to support you in any way we can.

This week we have once again been welcoming prospective parents for new reception places in September 2020 to tour the academy. I have been supported by some of our year 6 children to share the wonderful work that goes on at Woodhouse. As we have gone around school, it has been fantastic for parents to see the superb education which is provided by our school. It was great to talk about the outstanding wider curriculum we offer in PE and the Arts, to show the hard working children all across the school and to describe the care and nurture that takes place at Woodhouse. Congratulations to all of these children who have gone over and above with their effort in class and around school this week. We are very proud of each and every one of you. Keep up the good work. Will it be you next week?




Last week we had 11 classes with over 97% attendance. That is incredible! Well done.
