

Dear parents and carers,

As we reach the end of a great half term, it is a great time to reflect on the hard work and progress being made by the children across the school over the last 6 weeks. It was great to see so many of you at parents' evening or meeting with teachers to discuss your child's progress, targets and next steps. Thank you for your continued contribution to ensuring that every child gets the very best out of what we have to offer at Woodhouse. As a team, I know that home and school can work together to support and encourage every child. As always, if there is anything we can do to help, please just speak to your child's teacher at the end of the day and they will be delighted to help you.

Our year 6 children have been working hard this week to complete some practice SATs assessments. The children have performed well and their hard work and effort at home is paying off. Thank you to families for supporting the children to achieve their best possible outcomes, working together with teachers so that they can achieve their potential. At the other end of our school, I have been delighted with some of the learning evident in Reception during this week – especially some very exciting letter writing! Across our school, children of all ages have been sharing some fantastic work with me. Some superb writing, detailed curriculum study in history and geography and some brilliant maths work.

We are very fortunate in school that we have some supportive family volunteers who come into school and read with children across our school. These volunteers are such an asset to our school and provide children with even more opportunities to read to an adult. If you, or another adult in your family, could spare some time each week, or on a more irregular or ad-hoc basis, and you would be interested in reading with the children, then please speak to me or with the school office. There is a straightforward process to go through to register and undertake the appropriate safeguarding checks which we can undertake in school. This support is a really positive addition to all we offer to help children in school and can be a very rewarding and enjoyable experience for a volunteer.

Finally, can I again remind all families to be considerate and safe when parking or driving near to school. As I wrote in my letter to all families last week, there are some real issues with parking to drop off and collect children in the roads around Woodhouse. Parking on the zig-zag lines outside school or by crossing points, parking on the pavement in part or fully, blocking entrances to houses or driveways or which is on corners or close to junctions can put children at risk. Imagine how you would feel if your child was involved in an avoidable accident. Please ensure that you are parking appropriately so that all children can arrive and leave school safely. A number of parents and neighbours of school have spoken to me about their concerns, which I share. Let us please retain our strong sense of community as a school and be supportive of each other in this way. The school run can be difficult, especially in poor weather, and if we are considerate of each other's needs then we can ensure that all children can arrive in school each day on time and safe. Thank you for your support with this matter.

Thank you all for your excellent ongoing support for our school and also for helping us to ensure your child meets their full potential. I hope that you and your families have a wonderful half term break and we look forward to welcoming you back to school on Monday 24th February.



NEWS FROM AROUND SCHOOL

Year 3 Plant Experiments

Year 3 have been learning about plants. The children have carried out experiments to learn about germination. Each child planted a broad bean in a clear plot. They observed the changes each day by counting the roots produced. The seeds with



the correct amount of water grew the healthiest. Another experiment was set up to find out how roots work. White carnations were put into food colouring. By the end of the day, the flowers had changed from white to pink. They will be continuing their topic this term and will be finding out how cress grows in different places.

Nursery Parent Workshops



Nursery had a wonderful parent workshop this week related to their new topic 'new beginnings'. They have been learning about the very hungry caterpillar and how he changes into a beautiful butterfly. They had a brilliant turn out with supportive and engaging parents coming in to work with their children. They got to make a caterpillar necklace, a giant caterpillar chain and they got to plant their own cress seeds. They're now eagerly awaiting them to start growing so they can show their parents.

Mrs Lewis has been doing Art lessons each week with Reception, taking them out in small groups at a time. They have been learning and practising a range of art skills, such as cutting, sticking, painting, sketching and so on.
