



Dear parents/carers,

I want to thank you all once again for you continued support to enable our school to be what it is. The last few weeks have been challenging and I am grateful to have such amazing support from our families at this time. I know that you are fully behind us in doing everything we can to keep the children safe, to maximise the learning of all children and help the continued success of our school community. I have seen, from an appropriate social distance, some amazing learning from children across the school this week. It has been a joy to see how the children have got back up to speed with their learning and the positive Woodhouse feel we have in school. We have returned to a settled and secure school, with learning in every classroom. I am delighted by the support from families to help the children settle back into school routines and expectations.

We are always look at ways we can do things more effectively and to improve both the learning and safety of our children. As a result, I have written to you separately about some changes to our school risk assessment and processes regarding face coverings and how parents can help at drop off and pick up each day. Please take time to read my letter https://tinyurl.com/y3lqs2wo so that you can be clear on what we are doing to keep your children, your families and our wider school community safe. It does require us all to play our part, so please be clear on what is expected of you and your family. Thank you in advance for your support.

We have now set up a routine where we can return to having reading books come home each week. This is a key aspect of our school and I am delighted we have come up with as safe a way to do this as possible. Miss Wynne wrote to you all regarding this, and the letter can be seen https://tinyurl.com/yx9v2qpb. Books will come home on a Monday and can be returned to school, once finished, on a Friday only. Children will keep a book in school at all times, along with their reading diaries, but will now be able to extend this to home too. Thank you for your patience and understanding with this. Remember that the children have access to a wide range of texts online through MyOn. If you need support to log in, just ask your child's teacher. If you happen to have school books at home, these can now be returned each Friday. Please send these back from next week. I know that you understand how important reading is to the future success of your child – please do all you can to encourage them to read, and be read to, as often as possible – preferably every day.

Accelerated Reader

Last year was a fantastic year for reading at Woodhouse. On Accelerated Reader we had record high word counts, more quizzes passed and a number of children surpassing a million words read during the year.



With the start of a new school year, all data is reset and children can challenge themselves once more to reach their respective targets with their reading.

Since the beginning of September, the total word count for school has already surpassed 1 million words and currently stands at 3,106,502 with A total of 372 quizzes been passed.

Reading books

From next week children will be able to bring home a reading book from school.

Children will be able to choose a book from their class libraries and take it home on Monday. They will only be able to take books home on Mondays. The book must stay at home then until they have finished with it. Books can only be brought back into school on a Friday, where they will be put into a box and stored over the weekend before being used again. Children can keep the book at home as long as they would like / need to.

This is currently the best way we can get books home and back to school within the safety restrictions in place at the moment.

In short:

Books will only be coming home on a Monday.
