


We have a new reading platform called Epic, which is a free online library where children can read lots of very popular books — 40,000 books to be precise! If children are on accelerate reader they can search their level and finds lots of well-known favourites and if they aren't on AR then they can listen to lots of the read aloud stories. It is accessible between the hours of 7-4 (schooltime) and all children need to do is head to <a href="https://www.getepic.com/students">https://www.getepic.com/students</a> and pop in the class code which has been given to them by their teachers. They then need to click on their icon and they can read away!

Teachers will also assign books for children to read to do with their topic and children will be rewarded as a class depending on how much they collectively read.

Parents can also use their email address to allow the children an extra few hours after 4 o'clock. This is free of charge.



"Put yourself in their shoes. You can't talk to them, you can't see them," Corey said. It's really sad and then I got an idea in my head to raise money so they can see people on Zoom or Facetime so they can see their loved ones."


Corey decided to raise the money by carrying a sack of potatoes up a mountain. He didn't stop there though - cycling up another and running up a third. His efforts raised £4,000 to buy tablet computers for patients at hospitals such as Llantrisant's Royal Glamorgan who could not have visitors.



## A camel library


The Covid-19 pandemic has changed the way people live all around the world, and in some countries has seriously impacted the ability of children to access education. One solution comes in the form of a 'camel library' run by Save The Children, which aims to tackle the problem of children being absent from school for long periods of time.

The mobile library brings vital books to 22,000 children in 33 villages across Ethiopia, spending two and a half days at each site, in which time the camels rest, eat and have examinations for illness, carried out by their herders.

## Dwayne, The Rock, Johnson gifts a \$30,000 car!


On New Year's Day, the 48-year-old movie star visited his old friend Bruno Lauer.


### A diary entry written by Rory, 4W:






A diary entry written by Amelia, 4W Dear Diary,

layers and watching their pictures come together.


They have also been writing stories about the Snow Queen. Here are a few of their stories.

Year 1 have been working really hard this week. They have made finger puppets to use in their English work, Ice palace sculptures and drawn pictures of Antarctic scenes.












