



Dear parents/carers,

As me move close to the end of what has been a tumultuous year, I feel blessed to be the head teacher of Woodhouse Primary Academy. Our school is a wonderful place and the attitude, behaviour and learning of the children remains of the highest standard. Your children are outstanding. **Thank you** for your support and encouragement for our school, as this plays a huge part in the success of your child.

It has been a difficult few weeks with **coronavirus**, with a big increase in isolations and bubble closures at the end of term. I am very sorry for the disruption and inconvenience this has inevitably caused. Though the government is lifting the legal restrictions in place from Monday 19th July, we at Woodhouse will continue with our current risk assessment until the end of term. We will keep children in their class bubbles as that is what children are used to, and in the event of a positive case it will limit the children who would have to isolate as much as possible. I plan to be able to remove many of the restrictions which have had to be in place this year in the Autumn, and I will write to you to explain these nearer to the time of the children's return in September. **Children** in Y1-6 next year return on Monday 6th September when hopefully the national and local picture will be much improved, with a different approach to positive cases in school and the local community.

Earlier this week I shared a link with you to offer support for members of staff at Woodhouse — your 2020-21 Woodhouse Heroes. I have set up an opportunity for parents and families to pass on positive messages to members of the Woodhouse staff team. I am incredibly grateful for your continued support and encouragement throughout what has been a very challenging year. If you would be willing to nominate a member of staff (or more than one) who has helped, supported or encouraged your child or helped your family, I would be very grateful. If your child only eats Halal meats but can eat fish, please also let the main office know. We do not serve Halal meats.







Healthy Start Scheme

Healthy Start https://www.healthystart.nhs.uk/ aims to reduce child poverty and health inequalities by providing free vitamins, nutritional advice and weekly vouchers to buy food or formula milk to low income families with pregnant women and children up to the age of 4.

April 2021 the value of vouchers increased from £3.10 a week to £4.25 (£8.50 for a child under one year)

February 2021 data shows there was 61% uptake of HS Vouchers in Birmingham Approx. 7,631 eligible families are missing out on £64k of free food.
