



# Woodhouse School Cabinet visit to the Palace of Westminster

The Woodhouse School Cabinet were fortunate enough to attend the Houses of Parliament on Tuesday 27th June. The children were excellent, doing Woodhouse and Greenheart proud with their effort and contributions. Our older children looked after our younger children with real care and affection and our younger children did us proud with their maturity. As always, the children's behaviour was exemplary, and it was wonderful for us to meet our MP, Preet Kaur Gill and ask her questions about her role as an MP at the end of our visit.

When we arrived, we had lunch and then did short external tour - seeing Westminster Abbey, Parliament Square, the end of Whitehall and the offices of Government, as well as the outside of the Palace of Westminster. When we went inside, we saw behind the scenes at the Palace of Westminster. The children saw both houses in session from their respective public galleries, watching the debates and the workings of government first hand. In the House of Commons, they listened to the Shadow Chancellor, Rachel Reeves and the Chief Secretary to the Treasury, John Glen arguing about the Mortgage and Rent crisis as part of the Opposition Day Motion being held this afternoon. In the House of Lords, they saw the other chamber in action as they were discussing E-Scooters and the challenges associated in keeping people safe on the roads. In the HoL they heard the famous Scientist Robert Winston, Baron Winston, talking about the need to keep people safe with the use of new technologies.



After our tour, we spent time in the Education centre learning how a Bill becomes a Law. The children chose the proposal to ban all Petrol and Diesel vehicles. The children engaged fantastically with this and came up with some impassioned speeches for or against the motion. We had Ella H as our own Madam Speaker, and after a long debate between both sides, she signaled a division (vote) on the bill. This was (closely) passed by the "Ayes" - which meant that Madam Speaker announced that "The Ayes have it, the Ayes have it." At this point, Preet Kaur Gill MP came and met us, talking through what it means to be an MP. The children gave her an appropriate grilling about how she fills her working week and makes an impact for the people of Edgbaston! They were brilliant - it was a wonderful experience for our school cabinet members.





# U N I V E R S I T Y Graduation 2023

At Woodhouse we are immensely proud of our children who take part in Children's University scheme. This year's graduation saw an incredible 150 children graduate, which is our largest ceremony yet! This event was attended by parents, carers and family members. Our Choir opened the event and certificates were awarded by Tamara Neville the Children's University Coordinator at University of Wolverhampton.

The graduation is an event which celebrates both the commitment by children to the extra-curricular school clubs and the hard work that they display in these clubs.

Through participation in these after school clubs, children can earn hours towards their certificates. The more clubs that the children attend, the more hours they build up.

This year, 60 children gained their first Bronze Award which is the first award earned. Many more achieved their Bronze, Silver and Gold Awards. Our highest achiever received his Postgraduate Award for a total of 456 hours gained in the last four years. This is an outstanding achievement!

# Birmingham Family Hubs - Newsletter

















## Newsletter **Highlights**

#### Family Hubs are coming to Birmingham

'Family Hubs are coming to Birmingham this summer. They will be a 'one stop shop' bringing a range of organisations and professionals together in one place, to offer services, advice, guidance and support on a wide range of family and parenting issues. These include infant feeding, mental health, parenting support, SEND, getting into work, debt advice, and health issues to name a few.

Family Hubs' is a central government project which aims to give children the best start in life. The Hubs will be both buildings across Birmingham and a website, so that families can access the right help locally at the right time in a whole family approach.

Family Hubs is a partnership in Birmingham led by the City Council which will be given £9.215m. of government funding over 3 years to develop 'Best Start for Life' and 'Family Hubs' provision, offering families accessible help.


The first part of the Family Hubs programme to be rolled out is the 'Best Start for Life' offer, which focuses on the youngest children. It aims to help families find the services and support available to them from the time of their baby's conception until it is 2 years old – the first critical 1001 days where babies lay down the foundations for lifelong emotional and physical health.

'Best Start for Life' will be an online offering of services, support and information gathered from across the City, as well as a printed leaflet in a range of the most widely spoken languages in Birmingham.

## Best Start for Life

#### Spotlight on 'Best Start for Life'

The support that 'Best Start for Life' offers will be available on one website where lots of useful information, organisations and links will be in one place. The offer joins up services like midwives, health visitors, children's centres, local parenting organisations and early help so families can find services, advice and support in one place.



The Purpose of offer is to clearly set out the services available to families with babies from conception to 2 years old, these include:

#### Universal services - available to everyone

 such as midwifery; health visiting; mental health support; infant feeding and specialist breastfeeding support; safeguarding; and services relating to special educational needs and disabilities (SEND)

#### Additional, targeted or specialist services and support

 Such as support for domestic abuse; help with drug and alcohol use or smoking cessation; debt advice; and help overcoming language barriers

#### Open access support - available to any parent or carer

 delivered by volunteers in the community for example, 'stay and play' session for parents and carers with babies in a community hall or family hub; or an exercise class for parents and carers in the local park

#### Paid-for services:

 that may already exist in your local area that you wish to signpost to families, such as an antenatal education group delivered by a charity for a fee.

The website will be accompanied by a printed leaflet which will help families to find the same help and support, who cannot easily access the internet. Both the leaflet and the website will be available in the languages most commonly spoken in Birmingham. 'Best Start for Life' will be available online and in printed form from July; this will be widely publicised nearer the time.
