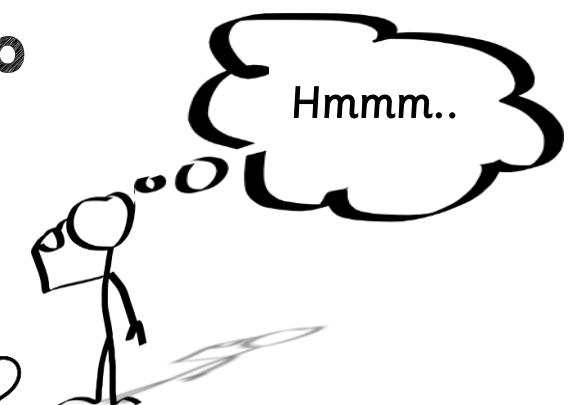
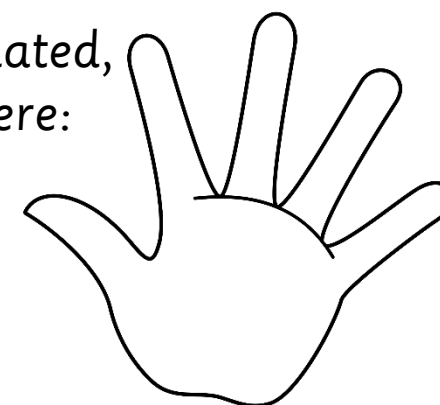


Congratulations to **6D & 3N** who had the best class attendance for last week. We had 82 lates last week across all year groups. These, no matter how small, are lost learning time.
