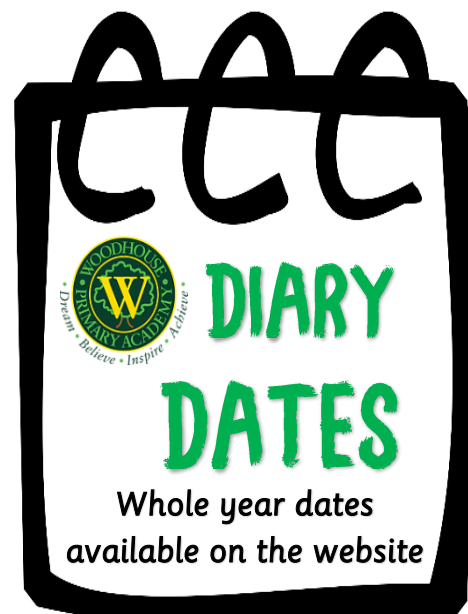

Home Learning

Grace B, one of our Year 6 children, has produced this amazing piece of home learning showing the relationships and conversions between fractions, decimals and percentages. There is information on there on how to convert, a conversion table and a visual representation. She has shared this learning with her peers and used it in class to support her learning and the learning of others.

FRACTIONS, DECIMALS & PERCENTAGES

How TO CONVERT

Fraction	Percentage	Decimal	Diagram
1	100%	1	
1/2	50%	0.5	
1/4	25%	0.25	
1/10	10%	0.1	
1/20	5%	0.05	

Fractions to percentages: You have to put the denominator over 10 or 100 first. If it is over 100 then the numerator is the percentage.
E.g. $\frac{3}{5} = \frac{3 \times 20}{5 \times 20} = \frac{60}{100} = 60\%$
E.g. $\frac{3}{4} = \frac{3 \times 25}{4 \times 25} = \frac{75}{100} = 75\%$
E.g. $\frac{3}{8} = \frac{3 \times 12.5}{8 \times 12.5} = \frac{37.5}{100} = 37.5\%$

Decimals to percentages: You have to make the number after the decimal point the percentage. E.g. 0.36 = 36% or 0.60 = 60%.

Fractions to Decimals: You have to divide the numerator by the denominator.
e.g. $\frac{1}{5} = \frac{1}{5} = 0.2$

$\frac{3}{5} = \frac{6}{10} = 60\% = 0.6$

$\frac{5}{8} = 0.625 = 62.5\%$

$\frac{0.625}{15.000} \times 100$
